Town of Webb Lake

Burnett County, Wisconsin Special Meeting – Emergency Disaster Declaration December 19, 2022 Webb Lake Town Hall

Chairperson Steve Austin opened the special town meeting at 6:00 PM.

Consideration and discussion of the following occurred:

WHEREAS, a disaster, of a severe and paralyzing snow storm that is not usual and customary and beyond normal expectations, commencing on December 14, 2022 struck the Town of Webb Lake in Burnett County, Wisconsin; and WHEREAS, because of such emergency conditions, the Town of Webb Lake was unable to meet with normal promptness; and WHEREAS, pursuant to sections 323.11 and 323.14 (4)(b) of the Wisconsin State Statutes it is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, welfare and good order to proclaim that emergency conditions exist.

Discussion occurred regarding the following unexpected costs including but not limited to:

Debris Clearance – \$28,000 (Additional overtime to date plus expected going forward into spring for clean up)

Protective Measures – Aggregate - \$8400: \$1400 – Running multiple generators to prevent damage to infrastructure due to lengthy power outage. Additional supply and materials to correct unsafe and dangerous road conditions – 8 loads times \$875 = \$7000

Road systems – \$6000 damage to gravel roads/berms

Public building and Related Equipment – \$12,800 – Damage to equipment, inclusive of damage during clean up.

Other – Aggregate \$5448: \$4000 cost in clearing private drives not normally in route for emergency access for power companies, to restore service, and emergency vehicles along with damage to electrical connections. Extra cost of diesel – 80 gallons x 4 vehicles = 320 times 4.526 = \$1448

Motion Main/Kielkucki to ratify a Disaster Declaration and to file a Uniform Disaster Report and request help with unexpected costs. Approved 3-0.

Motion Kielkucki/Main to adjourn. Approved 3-0.
